Course Description: This class will introduce students to the fundamentals of creating animation using Animate, including tweening and frame-by-frame drawn animation. This class does not cover Action Script programming. Topics and techniques covered during lectures will be reinforced through in-class lab exercises and assignments. **Prerequisite(s):** None

Course Objectives: Upon completion, students will be able to effectively display knowledge and understanding of fundamental Animate tools including those necessary for frame-by-frame animation, as well as basic tweening principles and useful practices. Students will also have the knowledge necessary to export or publish their work for external use or editing.

- Tradigital Animate CC 12 Principles of Animation in Adobe Animate By Stephen Brooks
- Portable storage device, 8 GB is best.
- Some form of digital drawing tablet. Wacom Intuos, Bamboo, or other tablets work great. You can get them new or used for very reasonable prices. Alternative, you may use the DePaul equipment—purchasing a tablet is strictly for your convenience.

Additional "Things to Know": You should anticipate to spend at least 1-2 hours per week on course work, and you are expected to wisely manage your time. Much of your work will be on a computer—file storage and safety is **your** responsibility. There will be **no** exceptions made if you don't adequately save and back up your work—computers crash and flash drives get lost. All assignments must be completed and turned in by the due date listed on D2L, *period*.

The software we will be using in this course can be complicated, especially for first time users. I will make every effort to clearly explain the tools we will be using in the programs, but students are expected to survey their own learning curve and perform accordingly. This means if you don't understand something, you should be asking questions, and some students may require additional hands-on time outside of class.

Attendance and Participation: Students are expected to attend and participate in each class, be present for the start of class, and remain for the duration. Arriving late or leaving early is considered a tardy. Two late arrivals or early departures will be counted as one full absence. Over 20% absence constitutes failure of the course. Since this class meets once weekly, 20% equates to two meeting dates. It is the responsibility of the student to keep up on any materials and assignments missed from absence. You are required to attend on the day of the final. Participation will be measured by in-class interaction, and students are highly encouraged to ask questions and offer comments relevant to the day's topic and peer work. It is the expectation that all dialogue in this course is civil and respectful of the dignity of each student. In the case of an excused absence (medical, mental health, and/or personal crises) please submit documentation via the absences notification form to the Dean of students' office. Assignments: All assignments are due by the date and time listed on D2L, no exceptions! Assignments uploaded within one hour past the due time will be docked 50% of the total points for the assignment, prior to grading. Assignments turned in later than one hour past the due date/time will be given a zero. Don't fail because of late work—be on time!

Additionally, all assignments in this class **MUST** completed using some form of drawing tablet—NO MOUSE DRAWING! We will be animating, not creating memes in Microsoft Paint—no mouse drawing. DePaul has several labs and locations with Cintique tablet monitors, and the equipment cage has a few portable tables for check-out. Additionally, you may choose to buy your own. There are various makes and models that all work well for reasonable prices—anywhere from \$30-\$100 new or used.
