Course Description:

This course is an introduction to Final Cut Pro 7, the Apple/Mac suite of video and audio editing applications. Utilizing a workshop atmosphere in combination with lectures, demonstrations and projects, students will take their first steps toward a technical understanding of the art and craft of digital video editing.
